Nine names from puppet theatre

Semar H

The fat Javanese clown.

A shadow play figure and flat rod puppet from Indonesia.

Guignol E

Hand puppet from Lyon, holding a club, and wearing a black bonnet - a brimless cap - with his hair plaited into a long braid.

Pulcinella R

Masked white clown from the Italian *commedia dell'arte* folk theatre.

Vitéz László Q

Hungarian hand puppet with tiny wooden feet. Holding a frying pan and wearing a red hat.

Jan Klaassen

Old-Dutch hand puppet. Holding a club and wearing a pointed hat with a little bell.

Karagöz I

Bearded clown from Turkey. A shadow play figure.

Street entertainer A

Clown from paper theatre. Wearing a large collar with tiny bells and a hat.

Katriin N

Wife of the Dutch Jan Klaassen character (Punch and Judy in English). Holding a bat and wearing a mob cap.

Gnafron U

Cobbler wearing a leather pinafore - a type of apron - with a top hat on his head. Guignol's friend (another French hand puppet).
